#### HAPPY NEW YEAR TO YOU AND YOUR FAMILY

As this is my first newsletter for the beginning of the year, I wanted to take this opportunity to wish everyone in Macclesfield and beyond a very Happy New Year. I am sure 2025 will be just as busy as last year and I am already getting stuck in here in Macclesfield and in Parliament.

As people were celebrating to bring in the New Year, others were preparing for some of the severe weather we saw in the first few weeks of the month. I want to pass on my thanks to all the community groups and organisations who helped in different parts of the constituency, especially in Poynton and Bollington. I have been in contact with the environment agency and pushed out updates and responded to constituents who needed immediate support and assistance.

As soon as I returned to Parliament, I asked the Environment, Food and Rural Affairs Minister, Emma Hardy to join me in speaking with the Department for Transport and local authorities to address concerns raised regarding the A555 road. The road flooded again recently with many citing poor engineering as an issue. I'm determined solutions are found to ensure our communities are safe from flooding. I have also written to local authorities about particular incidents and to address specific problem areas. Climate change continues to cause severe weather events and this will only get worse without the necessary action from governments around the world.

Also in parliament, I voted to support Labour's children's and wellbeing schools bill. This bill focused on free breakfast clubs in primary schools, caps on branded school items which cost parents a fortune in some cases, but most importantly to protect vulnerable children. Following a national inquiry into child sexual abuse a number of years ago, costing the taxpayer £200 Million, 20 recommendations were made. Unfortunately it was made clear that many of the recommendations from the report had not been implemented by the previous government, letting down victims and survivors of some of the most horrendous crimes. I published a statement on social media and have also written to those constituents who contacted me to give their views.

Stronger protections for renters was always going to be a priority for this government and that is why I was pleased to vote for the third reading of the Renters Rights Bill. This will mean that landlords will no longer be able to ask for multiple months of rent upfront and renters will only have to pay one months rent before moving into a property. The legislation also includes protection for students so they are not pressured into signing tenancy agreement for a property so early in the academic year and grieving families will not be forced to pay rent or utility bills for a loved ones rented property if they pass away. Last but by no means least, we are ending no fault evictions.


